





Stories from the front line

An Update on Basma and her Children

We've reported on the incredible journey of Basma and her children for some years. Forced to flee her home country when she decided to follow Jesus, Basma has been serving in media ministry in our Gulf office. Framed by family members for a crime that they didn't commit when they also found Christ, her son and daughter have spent the last two years in prison. Basma has not been able to see them all this time. Earlier this year, however, they were due to be released...and Basma decided to

make the dangerous journey back to her homeland to see them.

We were incredibly concerned for Basma's safety. For certain family members to have discovered her whereabouts could have cost her life. We prayed diligently for her protection, and we know that many of you did, too.

Therefore, relief and rejoicing ensued when Basma walked back into our Gulf office with the biggest smile upon her face. Not only did she return safely, but she spent two wonderful and peace-filled weeks with her children in a city far away from her dangerous relatives. She also took her youngest daughter (from her new marriage in the Gulf) and the four of them lived freely together as a family.

Basma was worried that they would hound her with questions, asking her all the 'whys' possible. WHY did God allow this to happen? WHY didn't He intervene? She prayed desperately for wisdom. She prayed desperately that they still believed.

Yet, to her astonishment and delight, her daughter said: "When I was baptised before being framed for the crime, I knew Jesus. However, in prison He met with me and loved me. He was there with me every moment of every day. I had no Bible, I had no songs to listen to, but His Spirit in me was enough."

Her son was also joyful, peaceful, and comforted. During this two-week period, they were able to read the Bible as a family together every day without fear of persecution. Over the years, God has answered countless prayers in wonderful and miraculous ways in the lives of Basma and her children. He has continued to prove His faithfulness to this day.

Basma is home in the Gulf, but has temporarily secured an apartment for her son and daughter in the city where they met. However, they need to leave their home country as soon as possible before their location is discovered. They are not anxious and trust God to provide for them, but they still need your ongoing prayers.

PRAISE GOD for how He has continued to minister to Basma's children whilst imprisoned.

PLEASE PRAY with us that a suitable and safe home will soon be found for them.

Blossoms: a story of hope

Meet Reem

Our Blossoms courses continue to support both local and refugee women in North Africa. These workshops use art and drama therapy to help women emotionally process and express their difficult experiences in a safe environment.

Reem* is a lady in her 30s who attended one of our Blossoms courses this year. On the last day of the workshop, her eyes were bright with excitement. She had a permanent, glistening smile. A member of our team decided to approach her to ask her about her experience of the workshop. She answered our questions with the same sparkle of joy that was written on her face.

Q: What prompted you to attend Blossoms?

Reem: I was going through difficult circumstances. I was praying that God might provide me with a way out. The next day, a friend of mine called me and asked me if I wanted to join her at a workshop on mental health. I attended, and I found my way out. I truly felt that my prayer was heard. I was in real need of such a workshop.

Q: How has it impacted you?

Reem: Even though my circumstances have not changed, I have discovered exactly what my problem is and what I need to do to help myself. I learned to define my feelings and never to deny them, but rather allow myself to feel them.

Q: Do you have a highlight from the experience?

Reem: I have actually attended many mental health workshops before, but this was my first women's only group. Here, I experienced the power of women gathering together. We provide great support to each other because we can understand and appreciate each other's feelings. I realised that the women here all share the same psychology, even though we come from different cultural backgrounds.

Q: What has changed for you as a result what you've learned?

Reem: I now know what my goals and priorities are. I know where I am, where I want to go, and what tools will help me to get there. Before the workshop, I had difficulties in relating with some people in my life. But now that I understand what I am going through, I am able to reconnect with those people again. I am very happy and thankful to you; the workshop was incredibly timely for me.

Our popular 3D animation series and workshop curriculum for children who have experienced trauma. LITD's main character, 8-vear-old Farah, loses her mother but finds hope through stories in the Bible. Children relate to Farah and find encouragement and healing through her journey. We are currently awaiting funds to complete the last episode of Season 2, as well fudraising to dub the first season into different dialects and train more programme teachers in Turkey, Egypt and Syria.
