Here's just some of what we've seen God doing in the Middle East over the past few months...

Life in the Desert

From the Field

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Our 'Life in the Desert' (LITD) animation series helps traumatised children start the healing process. Last year, our partner in Lebanon reached nearly 2,000 refugee children, despite the pandemic. Following the blast in the Port of **Beirut, Lebanon**, in August 2020, a new partner took the series to victims of the blast along with their relief packages. We have been hugely encouraged by the testimonies that have been shared with us following its delivery. The impact that LITD had on **Jumana*, aged 13**, is our prayer for all of the children who watch the series.



"I admire the little girl as she solues all her problems by relying on God." Jumana* was taken in by the LITD series, she waited excitedly for each visit when a new episode would be delivered. She would share what she learnt from the episodes with the relief workers, and always expressed how much she liked the main character's great faith. Jumana decided to start reading the Bible every night before she sleeps, following the example of the heroine of LITD.

Not just for the children...

Rashid's* family is a wonderful example of how the impact of LITD is extended to include adults as well as children. They are a Syrian family, living in Lebanon for the last ten years. The father was not very welcoming when our partners first visited, and did not like
that they shared a Christian message. But they continued to go, and shared God's love on every visit. After some time, they visited the family again, and there was a big change. The mother had been watching LITD regularly with the children, discussing it with them and teaching them about the Bible. This had affected the father as well. He started to love Jesus, and started allowing his wife to go to church!

Our partners said, **"It's truly amazing how** God has been working in the lives of these families."

Holistic Media Internships

Celebrating Easter...

Did you know that some Christians in the Middle East celebrate Easter a whole month later?

And this isn't the only difference between the East and West when it comes to celebrating the death and resurrection of Christ.



The reason for this difference is the continued use of the Julian calendar by the Orthodox church for the dates of festivals, whereas in the West we use the Gregorian calendar. The secularisation of Christmas here in the West generally means it is now celebrated more markedly by Christians than Easter weekend; but this is not the case in many parts of the Middle East and North Africa. Easter is by far the bigger festival, at least for Christians. This is interesting from a spiritual perspective, too. Almost all major religions, especially those in the Middle East, believe that the man Jesus was born at Christmas. But, crucially, they don't believe that He was the Son of God, and that He died and rose again three days later. The resurrection is fundamental for the Christian's salvation; and this is reflected in the emphasis that Christians in the Middle East place on celebrating at Eastertime.

Easter in the ME

Where it is permitted, Easter festivities in the Middle East usually begin a week before, on Palm Sunday. Children dress up in their best outfits, and marches in the streets take place with candles, flowers and olive branches. Church services are carried out throughout Holy Week, with the most important being Good Friday. Christians gather together with family and friends and enjoy a big feast on Easter Sunday, much like our Christmas dinners in the West!



However, for Arab Christians, especially those from Muslim families, Easter can be a very challenging time as they face the threat of persecution. With Ramadan and Easter overlapping this year, many believers will face tensions of various kinds. Sadly, the fear isn't just on a personal level as believers face unbelieving families. Even over the past few years we've seen scenes of terror and conflict in the region across our TV screens during Holy Week. The Middle East needs covering in prayer at this time, and we'd love you to join us in lifting up the church in the region with the help of our new 30 day prayer guide: **MEM30**.
